## To Make a Long Story Short...The 55-word Story and Professional

**Identity Formation**

The most successful medical schools in professional identity formation (PIF) create learning environments that hold space for reflection, encourage positive role-modeling behaviors, and exemplify resilience through challenging times. Considering its popularity when used in residency training and more broadly in health care settings, especially in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, we introduced a 55-word reflective writing exercise to first-year medical students.

- Review the use of short form reflective writing exercises in medical education.
- Recount the simple "Rules of Engagement" of the 55-Word Story exercise
- Discuss the benefits of the 55-Word Story exercise in the professional identity formation of health profession students, trainees and practitioners

She is an active member of the Empire State Bioethics Consortium and the American Society for Bioethics and Humanities.
